Dear Parent/Carer

In order to keep you up to date about your child's learning journey, detailed within this leaflet is a brief overview of our current learning focuses in Year Two. We hope this information will help you to talk to your child about their learning experiences and reinforce this at home.

English

Our reading focus this term is on talking about our understanding of the main characters in a story. We will be learning to describe a character's personality and appearance. We will also be learning to recognise parts of the text that give information and details about a character.

In writing we will be developing our sentence construction, ensuring our sentences are clear and starting to use connectives to extend and develop them further.

Our narrative focus for this term will be fantasy stories. We will be reading different stories and comparing the characters and settings. We will be writing detailed character descriptions using connectives and different sentence starters. We will be creating story maps and learning how to write our own version of a fantasy story or a story with a familiar setting.

Our non-fiction focus will non-chronological reports. We will be writing one about dinosaurs we have explored in topic lessons.

We will continue to develop our phonic knowledge and practise using known phonemes to write words independently. We will be continuing to learn how to read and spell words using different spelling patterns. Correct letter formation and joined handwriting will also be practised throughout the term.

Maths

This term we will be continuing to think about multiplication. We will be relating our knowledge of counting in twos, fives and tens to our times tables. We will then be thinking about how multiplication and division is linked. After half term, we will be learning about 2D and 3D shapes. We will be exploring polygons and which polygons are used to create 3D shapes. Also, we will be looking again at addition and subtraction. We will be thinking about adding and subtracting two, two-digit numbers. We will finish off the term by thinking about money. We will be adding and subtracting using money and learning how to work out change.

Topic

Our class topic is Dinosaurs before half term and then Shepton Mallet after half term. We will be studying fossils and thinking about when dinosaurs were alive. We will also study different kinds of dinosaurs as well as inventing some of our own!

After half term, our new topic will be Shepton Mallet, our local area. Throughout the Shepton Mallet topic we will be researching the local land marks and features. We shall look at how our town has changed over the years and visit some local places. We will be creating lots of artwork

relating our local area using different techniques such as collage, pastels and painting. Our physical development focus for this term is gymnastics. We will be further developing our mouse control and learning how save our work.
