Rabbit Class 11.5.20

Here are some more activities for you to try this week:

The Very Hungry Caterpillar

1. Create a story map. Draw pictures to show each part of the story. Use your pictures to help you retell the story. You could ask a grown up to record you retelling the story and email it in to school. I would love to hear you telling the story with your own pictures!

Minibeasts

2. Label a minibeast. Choose your favourite minibeast and describe what it looks like. How many legs? What colours can you see? Does it have wings? Either draw a picture of it or ask your grown up to draw it for you. Use 'Fred Talk' to help you write its body parts around the outside using the sounds you know.
3. Use play dough to make a model of a minibeast. You could make a whole minibeast family!
4. Listen to the story of 'Superworm' by Julia Donaldson.

Phonics

5. How many words can you think of that start with following sounds: c, p, t, s. Make a list of all the words you can think of. Keep the list on the fridge or on a door and everytime you think of a new word you can add it to your list.
6. Play 'sound I spy'. I spy something beginning with the 'c' sound....
7. Read some Bug Club books (<https://www.activelearnprimary.co.uk/login?c=0>). Use your phonic knowledge to try and read all the words yourself. Remember to reread each sentence with some fluency after you have 'Fred Talked' (sounding out each word) it first.

Maths

8. Go on a money hunt around your house/garden. Ask your grown up to hide the coins you learnt last week (1p, 2p, 5p, 10p) around your house/garden. They could make a treasure map with an 'X marks the spot' for each location. When you find the coin shout out its value. You could then hide the coins for your grown up/brother/sister to find and make your own treasure map.
9. In your home made shop can you use 1p coins to work out how much money you will need to buy two items. For example you buy a cake for 5p and some eggs for 4p. How much money do you need altogether?
10. Have a go at counting the money in each piggy bank.
