Here are some more activities for you to try this week:

## The Very Hungry Caterpillar

- 1. Now you have created your own story map version of The Very Hungry Caterpillar you could turn it into a book. Make a front cover and have a go at writing some simple sentences below your pictures. You could then read your story to a family member over a video call.
- 2. The life cycle of a butterfly. Use the **attached sheet** (or draw your own pictures) to order the life cycle of a butterfly.
- 3. Butterflies wings are symmetrical. This means they are the same on both sides. Make your own symmetrical butterflies! You could fold a piece of paper in half then open it flat, paint on one half of the paper, refold the paper and press. Open the paper back up and see your creation! You could cut out a butterfly shape and use glue or double sided tape to stick natural materials onto the wings. You could collage a butterfly using different coloured paper or chocolate wrappers.







#### Minibeasts


- 4. Make a 'Bug House'. In your garden or while out on your daily walk find a collection of leaves/sticks/grass and make a home for your favourite minibeast.

## **Phonics**

- 6. Play 'Phonics Snakes and Ladders'. See attached sheet.
- 7. Play 'Phonics Treasure Words' game. Sort the words into 'real words' or 'not real words'. See **attached sheet**.
- 8. Keywords. Ask your grown up to hide your keywords around your house/garden. Go on a keyword hunt. Make sure you say which keyword you have found.

### Maths

9. Doubling! Have a picture of an empty ladybird. Talk to your grown up about what doubling means, having 2 lots of the same amount and adding them together. Use the empty ladybird to double a number. Draw 2 dots on one half of the bug, then double that by drawing 2 dots on the other side. Count up all the dots to see how many you have altogether. Say double 2 is ....4. Repeat for lots of other numbers. What is double 3? 4? 1? Work them all out by drawing dots.



- 10. Pracitse number formation. Can you write numbers 1-20 correctly from memory? Can you start with 20 and write the numbers from 20-1?
- 11. 1 more. Can you quickly say the number that is one more than any number 1 19? Remember it's the next number on when you count. Ask your grown up to call out a number for you to say the number that is one more. One more than 7 is......8!

## PE

- 12. Play catch. How many times can you throw the ball (you could use a soft toy) without dropping it?

### Creative

- 14. Use chalk to draw giant minibeasts on the floor outside.
- 15. Make a minibeast out of natural materials leaves, sticks, grass.
